CHAPTER THREE




Daniel 3

1 Nebuchadnezzar the king made an image of gold, whose height was threescore cubits, and the breadth thereof six cubits: he set it up in the plain of Dura, in the province of Babylon.



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

SPECULATION

Most likely, it was designed to look like Nebuchadnezzar.

"Thou art this head of gold."

God gave Nebuchadnezzar the vision in Chapter 2 of the image with him as the "head of gold."

Obviously, it went to his head!



It was probably not made of solid gold.

1 cubic foot of gold weighs 1,206 pounds.

90 * 6 * 6 = 3240 cubic feet. 3,907,440 pounds of gold? In Exodus 38:30, we have the "bronze altar" of the tabernacle.

It was wooden, overlaid with bronze.

Exodus 27:2 "...and thou shalt overlay it with brass."



Dura was probably an area known today as "Tolul Dura", about twelve miles from the site of ancient Babylon in Iraq.

2 Then Nebuchadnezzar the king sent to gather together the princes, the governors, and the captains, the judges, the treasurers, the counsellors, the sheriffs, and all the rulers of the provinces, to come to the dedication of the image which Nebuchadnezzar the king had set up.

3 Then the princes, the governors, and captains, the judges, the treasurers, the counsellors, the sheriffs, and all the rulers of the provinces, were gathered together unto the dedication of the image that Nebuchadnezzar the king had set up; and they stood before the image that Nebuchadnezzar had set up.

Not everyone in Babylon was forced to go out to the plain of Dura for the big ceremony.

All the important government officials were there.

"Princes" is usually translated "satrap" today. It is a Persian word that means "protector of the realm."

4 Then an herald cried aloud, To you it is commanded, O people, nations, and languages, 5 That at what time ye hear the sound of the cornet, flute, harp, sackbut, psaltery, dulcimer, and all kinds of musick, ye fall down and worship the golden image that Nebuchadnezzar the king hath set up: 6 And whoso falleth not down and worshippeth shall the same hour be cast into the midst of a burning fiery furnace.



Cornet, flute, harp, sackbut, psaltery, dulcimer. . .

We're not really sure what all these instruments were from that time in history.

And the important part –

IF YOU DON'T FALL DOWN AND WORSHIP THE IMAGE, YOU'RE GOING TO BE DROPPED INTO A BURNING, FIERY FURNACE.



Music is playing.

Emotions are high.

Everyone wants to be "on the team!"

Except for three Jewish young men.

- 8 Wherefore at that time certain Chaldeans came near, and accused the Jews.
- 9 They spake and said to the king Nebuchadnezzar, O king, live for ever.
- 10 Thou, O king, hast made a decree, that every man that shall hear the sound of the cornet, flute, harp, sackbut, psaltery, and dulcimer, and all kinds of musick, shall fall down and worship the golden image:



- 11 And whoso falleth not down and worshippeth, that he should be cast into the midst of a burning fiery furnace.
- 12 There are certain Jews whom thou hast set over the affairs of the province of Babylon, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego; these men, O king, have not regarded thee: they serve not thy gods, nor worship the golden image which thou hast set up.

The accusers were "the Chaldeans."

These were the men whom Daniel had kept from death in Chapter 2.

This is the fruit of envy and jealousy.

- 13 Then Nebuchadnezzar in his rage and fury commanded to bring Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego. Then they brought these men before the king.
- 14 Nebuchadnezzar spake and said unto them, Is it true, O Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, do not ye serve my gods, nor worship the golden image which I have set up?



15 Now if ye be ready that at what time ye hear the sound of the cornet, flute, harp, sackbut, psaltery, and dulcimer, and all kinds of musick, ye fall down and worship the image which I have made; well: but if ye worship not, ye shall be cast the same hour into the midst of a burning fiery furnace; and who is that God that shall deliver you out of my hands?

Nebuchadnezzar is in a fit of rage.

"...and who is that God that shall deliver you out of my hands?"

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

The Babylonian Chronicles are a series of tablets recording major events in Babylonian history. They are thus one of the first steps in the development of ancient historiography. The Babylonian Chronicles were written in Babylonian cuneiform, from the reign of Nabonassar up to the Parthian Period, by Babylonian astronomers ("Chaldaeans").

December 595 BC to January 594 BC shows a coup d'état attempt against Nebuchadnezzar.

It failed.



HERE'S WHAT WE LEARN:

It is likely that Nebuchadnezzar summoned all his provincial rulers and vassal kings back to Babylon for a loyalty oath.

Those who had proved themselves loyal at the royal court in Babylon would have been exempt from the ceremony.

HERE'S WHAT WE LEARN:

Daniel did not have to appear at the gathering. He was with Nebuchadnezzar "at the king's court."

Daniel's three friends were summoned with the other officials because they had been serving as administrators in the "province of Babylon."

- 16 Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, answered and said to the king, O Nebuchadnezzar, we are not careful to answer thee in this matter.
- 17 If it be so, our God whom we serve is able to deliver us from the burning fiery furnace, and he will deliver us out of thine hand, O king.

- 22 Therefore because the king's commandment was urgent, and the furnace exceeding hot, the flame of the fire slew those men that took up Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego.
- 23 And these three men, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, fell down bound into the midst of the burning fiery furnace.

So back to our question:

"What's that furnace doing out there in the plain, next to the image?"





The reason the guards died from approaching the furnace was probably due to a phenomenon firefighters call BACKDRAFT.



BACKDRAFT occurs when a fire has been starved for oxygen. Then, someone opens a door or window and oxygen is re-introduced into the environment.

The result is an explosive BACKDRAFT.
